This region of Washington State is a large and diverse landscape ranging from Pacific beaches to alpine meadows and everything in between. And while most places in the Olympic National Park *do* prohibit dogs there are thousands of acres to keep you and your furry family member(s) busy.

A couple things to remember when traveling with your dog:

- ✓ Please keep your dog on a leash unless otherwise permitted.
- ✓ Please be aware of any specific passes required to enter a park.
- ✓ Please clean up after your dog.
- ✓ Please make sure you and your dog stay hydrated while exploring.
